This pilot course teaches biological soil management in relation to season and your crops.

We start by evaluating your soil tests (which you should obtain beforehand), and proceeds through planning, preparation and planting next year's crops.

In this series, you will learn how to:

- interpret and implement the most useful soil tests
- prepare for the growing season with appropriate minerals, cover crops & soil amendments
- start seedlings, select and plant crops successfully at appropriate times and the most effective ways
- use a conductivity meter, refractometer and pH meter to know what is happening biologically and dynamically in your soil
- mix and use nutrient drenches and foliar sprays to maintain soil conductivity and enhance the brix content of your crops
